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This bulletin is intended to give housestaff helpful tips and information relevant to working at UHN and MSH.

- > REGISTRATION for NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR OPENS ONLINE on UMLearns starting June 15. All residents, fellows, and students must register annually online and check in to the relevant hospital site in person to be equipped to care for patients. https://umlearns.uhn.ca/Account/LogOn?ReturnUrl=%2f
- ➤ PRIVACY IS PARAMOUNT- Please remember that sharing passwords for EPR, Corel and Dictation Services is strictly prohibited. Audits are routinely performed to determine if access to patient information is appropriate and authorized. Those found accessing PHI (Personal Health Information) inappropriately are disciplined. Remember to LOG OFF computers to avoid someone else using your ID to access records.
- myUHN patient portal-myUHN patient portal allows patients to see their personal health information as it becomes final in the electronic patient record (EPR), in real time. myUHN is rolling out in phases, starting with a number of early adopter clinics in May 2015.
 Patients will be able to:
 - See their UHN appointments from PHS and MosaiQ, and receive appointment reminders;
 - See UHN lab results dating back to 2008
 - See reports and clinical documentation, such as clinic notes, assessments and discharge summaries dating back to **May 1, 2015** (no scanned documents)
 - Share information with others
 - Find program and clinic information, and patient education on uhn.ca

Effective May 1 2015: UHN notes, reports, assessments, discharge summaries in EPR dated May 1 2015 and onward will be viewable by early adopter patients and patients from all programs who register in the future. Registered patients can see their results and reports from all UHN programs/clinics.

MEDICAL TRAINEE PROCESS DURING CODE ORANGE (EXTERNAL DISASTER)*

- 1. All medical trainees must carry their UHN/Wightman-Berris/medical trainee badge at all times, both on and off UHN properties. This will ensure access to UHN in the event you are required to return to the hospital because of an Emergency Code broadcast.
- 2. If a Code Orange call is received by the Emergency Nursing Manager and Emergency Director, the UHN CEO will be informed and a Code Orange **ALERT** will be broadcast via Locating. All medical trainees will continue with their regular duties and remain on their assigned units.
- If the volume of Code Orange patients coming to UHN appears to overwhelm UHN resources, then a Code
 Orange RESPONSE will be announced by Locating. Again, all medical trainees will remain in their assigned
 units/services.
- 4. After initiating a Code Orange Response, the Physician-in-Chief, Surgeon-in-Chief, Physiatrist-in-Chief, and VP Medical Affairs and Quality will initiate their 'fan-out' to all Service/Division Heads.
- 5. If any medical trainees need to be redeployed from their assigned unit or service to assist with the Code Orange, they will be contacted personally by the Service Chief or Division Head. Under no circumstances are any medical trainees to leave their assigned unit/service without express direction of the Service Chief or Division Head. All inpatient units will carry on business as usual during a Code Orange Response.
- 6. Please review the UHN Emergency Code Response Fan-out policy 5.140.001.

- Mass transit accident
- EXPLOSION
- BUILDING COLLAPSE
- FERRY SINKING/FIRE

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
